DESCRIPTION:

Correspondence, manuscripts, and miscellaneous materials of Malcolm Waters Davis (1889-1970; Columbia A.M., 1924), an international relations specialist and executive for the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. The collection consists entirely of personal papers, most of which pertain to Davis's family. The most interesting parts of the collection are Davis's letters from Russia, 1916-1919, which contain his observations on the Russian Revolution, and Davis's short story and play manuscripts, none of which were ever published.
