DESCRIPTION: The Latin inscriptions, which predominate in the collection, are sepulchral. Items worthy of publication have already been published in <u>Corpus Inscriptionum Latinarum</u>, volumes VI and XV, and in the <u>American Journal of Archaeology</u>, 1899 and 1906. There are 11 inscribed pipes (of lead material) and 15 stamped bricks among the Latin inscriptions. There are only 3 Greek inscriptions (these, again, sepulchral) in the collection. Squeezes of published Greek inscriptions, to the number of about 500, are also available for study in conjunction with the published inscriptions.
