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DESCRIPTION: (1882-1932) It was the wish of Thomas ⁵. Jones that his collection of books, manuscripts and papers should eventually be lodged in the Columbia University Libraries, but that is should remain with his close friend, John L. Foley, so long as the latter desired. Recently Mr. Foley died and Professors ^hoger Loomis and Henry Wells, executors of Mr. Jones' estate, arranged for the collection to be delivered to Columbia.

Thomas S. Jones, a poet of deep religious insight, died about twenty years ago in New York. A current commentary on Jones calls him "a poet of some importance making a serious contribution to our religious literature." The collection includes letters from a wide circle of intimates including many of the principal literary figures of the day. From authors both here and abroad he was the recipient of scores of affectionately inscribed volumes of poetry, many of them collectors' items in their own right.

One of Jones' principal preoccuptations during his later years was the release of the poetry of the subconscious directly through "automatic writing" and his files contain a wide range of manuscripts composed by that method. Automatic writing once was used in efforts to communicate with the supernatural, and now is the special tool of psychologists and psycho-analysts in probing the latent recesses of the mind. Serious students of this phase of inquiry will find in this collection a varied, dependable and fruitful area for exploration.

The collection contains 163 photographs of , and relating to, Jones, many of which contain the poet's notes; as well as those of his friend, John L. Foley. The photographs range in date from 1894 to 1901 and they include portraits, views of his various homes and European travels, particularly his visit to Glastonbury Abbey in Englan in 1922.
