DESCRIPTION: Manuscript notes of, and some related letters to, Edwin Blackwell Knowles, 1903-1967, professor of English, Pratt Institute, relating to his research on a 16th century English manuscript, Anatomie of Spayne, 1599. (Ford Abbey Library Ms. #234, formerly Phillips Ms. #12124) Professor Knowles, a specialist in Spanish-English literary relations, was investigating the bibliographical history of this manuscript, its translator, Harye Bedwod and the author of the original Spanish manuscript, Biud de Haro. The letters are from various scholars, librarians and researchers both in this country and England, who responded to Knowles requests for information. There are photostatic copies of the manuscript as well as photostatic copies of related manuscripts and printed items used by Knowles in the course of his research. Also included is a typescript copy of the English text with annotations by Knowles. The research appears to be incomplete since the letter file ends in 1967, the year of Knowles death.
