DESCRIPTION: The literary papers and some related corresponded of Ellen Moers, 1928-1979, author and educatio. Included are typescript drafts, notes, photocopies of Theodore Dreiser letters and manuscripts, and correspondence related to writing, editing and publishing <u>Two Dreisers</u> (N.Y., Viking, 1969). Revisions of this namuscript contain e extensive editorial notes, instructions and annotations by Moers's editors, Malcolm Cowley.

The photocopies of printed materials consist cheiefly of articles written by Dreiser for newpapers and magazines, especially <u>Ev'ry Month</u>. For Moers's book, <u>Literary</u> <u>Women</u> (Garden City, N.Y., Doubleday, 1976), there are typescript drafts, notes the setting copy and profs. In addition there are letters, notes, drafts and printed material for her article of the <u>New York Public Review of Books</u>.

The 1980 addition includes correspondence, manuscripts notes, drafts, photographs, clippings and other printed material for her books, book reviews, articles, and lectures. Also included are books inscribed to Moers and books on Women authors and feminism with her notes.

The 1981 addition is similar as is the 1983.
