#### Abstract

The papers are comprised of correspondence, documents, writings, diaries, memoirs, photographs, printed material, and ephemera of Yugoslav diplomat Ivan Subbotić (1893-1973), his wife the prominent scholar Anka Gođevac-Subbotić (1890-1983), their son-in-law Igor Pereplotchikov (1912-2002), and other family members.

#### **Biographical Note**



#### Ivan Subbotić

Dr. Ivan Subbotić was a diplomat, permanent delegate of the Kingdom of Yugoslavia to the League of Nations in Geneva (1935-1939), royal minister extraordinary and plenipotentiary in London (1939-1941), Yugoslavia's representative to the American Red Cross, Doctor of Law, member of the prominent New York law firm of Coudert Brothers, professor of international comparative law at the New York Law School.

Ivan Subbotić was born in Belgrade on

November 1, 1893, to a prominent Serbian family. His grandfather, Jovan, was a well-known poet and writer considered one of the most important Serbian authors. His father, Vojislav Subbotić, was a famous Belgrade surgeon and one of the founders of the Faculty of Medicine in Belgrade, where he taught as a professor. Subbotić received his elementary and secondary education in Belgrade, then studied in Vienna and at the University of Lausanne, where he earned a doctorate in law. As a 19-year-old student, he volunteered for the Serbian Army and served in the Balkan wars against Turkey and Bulgaria in 1912-1913 and against Austria-Hungary in World War I. He emerged from these wars with the rank of lieutenant of cavalry and several military decorations for bravery.

Upon graduation, Subbotić chose a diplomatic career and entered the Yugoslav Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He advanced quickly within the ministry and in the early 1930s became a Chief of the Political Department of the Yugoslav Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

After a meeting of the General Assembly of the League of Nations in Geneva in 1934, where Subbotić was one of the Yugoslav delegates, he learned and was the first to report about the preparations for the assassination of King Alexander during his visit to France.

Subbotić took the position of permanent delegate to the League of Nations in Geneva in 1935. In the spring of 1937, he was entrusted with secret negotiations with Italy on improving relations between the two countries. These negotiations resulted in the Italian-Yugoslav Political Agreement of March 25, 1937. In 1938, he was appointed the Royal Yugoslav Ambassador to the Court of St. James.

In 1941, the Yugoslav government in exile sent Subbotić as its delegate to the American Red Cross. After the fall of Yugoslavia, he decided to stay in the United States, but University diplomas earned in Europe were not recognized, so the 53-year-old Subbotić became a full-time student of law at Columbia University. After graduation, he found employment as a member of the prestigious law firm of Coudert Brothers as a specialist in matters of international law.

In 1951, he became a professor of international law at the New York Law School, and he kept this position for twenty years, until his death. Ivan Subbotić served as vice president of the American International Law Association and the Consular Law Association. He was named an honorary lecturer in international public law at the University of Belgrade and held Serbian, Yugoslav, and other decorations.

Ivan Subbotić died on March 23, 1973 in New York City and was buried in Zemun, Yugoslavia in the family crypt.

#### Anka Gođevac-Subbotić

Dr. Anka Gođevac-Subbotić was a scholar of international law, professor, and well-known author. She was the first Serbian woman upon whom the title of Doctor of Laws was conferred. She was also an active member of Udruzenje srpskih pisadza i umetnika u inostranstvu (Society of Serbian Writers and Artists Abroad) and a winner of the Slobodan Jovanovic award for her book *Sa tri kontinenta*.

Anka Gođevac-Subbotić was born in Knjazevec on December 1, 1890, to Dr. Milorad Gođevac and Katarine Adamovic. Gođevac-Subbotić studied law in Belgrade University and graduated in 1927 with honors. In 1932, she earned her doctorate. During her career, she served as Yugoslav delegate to the international conference in the Hague in 1930, a member of the Yugoslav delegation to the Balkan conference in Bucharest in 1932, and a member of the League of Nations' Committee for the Study of the Legal Status of Women in 1938-1939.

Anka Gođevac-Subbotić died June 11, 1983, and was buried in Zemun, Yugoslavia in the family tomb.

#### Igor Pereplotchikov

Igor Pereplotchikov (1912-2002), an engineer, was a husband of Ružica Bajalovic, the daughter of Anka Gođevac-Subbotić from her first marriage to Dragoljub Bajalovic.

Pereplotchikov was born in Kiev to a wealthy family of Old Believers. His family escaped the Revolution of 1917 and the Civil War ending up in Yugoslavia. During World War II, he was a prisoner of war and lived in Yugoslavia under the German occupation. After World War II, he and his wife managed to escape from Tito's Yugoslavia across the Austrian borders and reached the United States, where they were reunited with Ružica's mother, Anka Gođevac-Subbotić, and her stepfather, Ivan Subbotić. Igor's parents (Aleksandr and Jelena) and his sister (Lidija Shpis-Mirni), as well as Ružica's half sister (Marija Pesic) remained in Yugoslavia.

Igor Pereplotchikov died in 2002 and was buried in Jordanville, upstate New York, in the Russian Orthodox cemetery, alongside his wife Ružica.

#### Description

The bulk of the collection consists of Ivan Subbotić's and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić's personal and professional correspondence, (including correspondence with prime ministers, high-ranking politicians, and diplomats), documents, writings, and photographs; as well as Igor Pereplotchikov and Ružica Pereplotchikov's correspondence, documents, and photographs. There are also diaries, notebooks, memoirs, biographical and printed material, and ephemera. Personal records,

genealogical materials, and photographs document the history of three prominent Serb families Subbotić, Gođevac, and Bajalovic (Dragoljub Bajalovic was Anka Gođevac-Subbotić's first husband), – and the Pereplotchikov family, who fled from post-Revolutionary Russia to Yugoslavia.

Some of the significant materials represented in this collection are letters of Winston Churchill; Edward F. Halifax; Anthony Eden; Fiorello La Guardia; Petar II Karađorđević, King of Yugoslavia; Jacobo Stuart Fitz-James y Falcó, duque de Alba; Slobodan Jovanovic; Helen Percy, Duchess of Northumberland; Tomislav Karađorđević; Elizabeth Karađorđević; and ciphered diplomatic telegrams and letters from 1939; guest book with autographs of diplomats and members of European royal families from the period of 1935-1941, and an autograph of Nikita Khruschev on the program "Khrushchev at the Hotel Commodore;" photographs of Fyodor Chaliapin; Louis Félix Marie François Franchet d'Espérey; Slobodan Jovanovic; Jacobo Stuart Fitz-James y Falcó, duque de Alba; Kosta Pavlović; Petar II Karađorđević, King of Yugoslavia; Natalija, Queen, consort of Milan Obrenović, King of Serbia; Božidar Purić; Franklin Delano Roosevelt; Nicolae Titulescu; Aleksandra Kollontai; and the sessions of the Assembly of the League of Nations, 1935-1937.

#### Series I: Subbotić Family Papers, 1861-2001

Series consists of the papers of Ivan Subbotić and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić and includes correspondence; writings; diaries; autographs of prominent people; professional, personal, and legal documents; biographical and genealogical materials; ephemera; visual, printed, and oversize material.

<u>Subseries 1: Correspondence, 1864-1984.</u> Comprises Ivan Subbotić's and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić's personal and professional correspondence, organized into two sub-subseries. Within the sub-subseries, arranged by the type of correspondence, then alphabetically by correspondent, then in chronological order.

<u>Sub-subseries 1: Ivan Subbotić Correspondence, 1864-1973.</u> Contains correspondence with prominent people, including prime ministers and high-ranking politicians and diplomats; professional correspondence, including ciphered telegrams from July-September 1939 and diplomatic invitations from 1938-1942; and family correspondence. Covers the period of 1864-1973.

<u>Sub-subseries 2: Anka Gođevac-Subbotić Correspondence, 1895-1984.</u> Includes correspondence with prominent people as well as professional and family correspondence, mostly from the 1930s-1950s. Unidentified correspondence stored at the end of the sub-subseries.

<u>Subseries 2: Writings, 1920-1973.</u> Handwritten manuscripts, typescripts, and published versions of Ivan Subbotić's and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić's writings. Organized into two sub-subseries.

<u>Sub-subseries 1: Ivan Subbotić Writings, 1920-1966.</u> Handwritten manuscripts and typescript of Ivan Subbotić's memoirs and speeches; pamphlets, books, and publications in periodicals make up this sub-subseries. Organized alphabetically by title.

<u>Sub-subseries 2: Anka Gođevac-Subbotić Writings, 1930-1973.</u> Consists primarily of manuscripts, typescripts, books, and publications in periodicals and serials of Anka Gođevac-Subbotić's monographs, essays, and lectures. Also included are lecture announcements, research materials, and other related items. Organized alphabetically by title.

Subseries 3: Diaries, 1939-1944. Comprises occasional notes and entries of Ivan Subbotić (1939) and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić (1939-1944).

<u>Subseries 4: Autographs, 1935-1959.</u> Guest book with autographs of diplomats and members of European royal families from the period of 1935-1941, and an autograph of Nikita Khruschev on the program "Khrushchev at the Hotel Commodore" make up this subseries.

<u>Subseries 5: Documents, 1870s-2001.</u> Contains personal, professional, and legal documents of Ivan Subbotić and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić. Organized into two sub-subseries. Oversize items removed and stored along with other oversize materials in the Flat box.

<u>Sub-subseries 1: Ivan Subbotić Documents, 1931-2001.</u> Consists of Ivan Subbotić's personal, professional, and legal documents, biographical information, and obituaries. Organized by type of document.

<u>Sub-subseries 2: Anka Gođevac-Subbotić Documents, 1870s-2001</u>. Consists of personal and legal documents, biographical information, and obituaries of Anka Gođevac-Subbotić. Also included are genealogical materials, and personal papers of her father, Milorad Gođevac, and various personal documents concerning her ancestry, including the Adamovic and Artaker families. Organized by type of document.

<u>Subseries 6: Visual Material, 1880s-1983.</u> Consists of photographs of prominent people, Ivan Subbotić and Anka Gođevac-Subbotić family and professional photographs, 16 mm film reel of

their wedding (1938), and photographs of their family members. Arranged by type of photograph, then alphabetically. Oversize items removed and stored along with other oversize materials in the Flat box #751.

<u>Subseries 7: Printed Material, 1861-1971.</u> Mostly consists of books, reprints, and pamphlets by various authors. Some with author's inscriptions, some with marginal notes made by A. Gođevac-Subbotić and Ivan Subbotić. Also includes flyer "Appeal to Nation" by Marija, Queen of Yugoslavia, and printed documents relating to World War II. Arranged alphabetically by author's name. Printed materials can also be found in Subseries 2: Writings, where they logically belong. Oversize items removed and stored along with other oversize materials in Flat box #751. Cross-references are provided.

Subseries 8: Ephemera, 1910s-1960s. Ephemera of both Series I and Series II stored in box 15.

<u>Subseries 9: Oversize Material, 1930s-1980s.</u> Contains oversize documents, photographs, and printed materials. Stored along with oversize materials of Series II in Flat Box #751. Cross-referenced in the corresponding series and subseries.

#### Series II: Pereplotchikov Family Papers, 1880s-2002

Series consists of the papers of Igor and Ružica Pereplotchikov and includes their correspondence; diaries; memoirs, professional, personal, and legal documents; biographical and genealogical materials; ephemera; visual, printed, and oversize material. Also includes papers of their relatives: Igor's parents Aleksandr and Jelena Perepletchikov, his sister Lidija Spis-Mirni (could also be spelled as Shpis-Mirnij) and her husbands Aleksandr Shpis and Anton Mirnij, Ružica's father Dragoljub Bajalovic and his family, her sisters Katarine Peric and Marija Pesic. Since Igor and his relatives lived in various countries and their IDs were issued in various languages, the spelling of the last names may vary.

<u>Subseries 1: Correspondence, 1910-2002.</u> Comprises correspondence with prominent people, and family and business correspondence (1910-2002) with bulk dates 1940s-2002. Arranged by type of correspondence, then alphabetically by correspondent, then chronologically. Unidentified correspondence stored at the end of the subseries.

<u>Subseries 2: Personal Papers of Family Members, 1897-2002.</u> Contains memoirs (including Igor's testimony about their escape from Tito's Yugoslavia); diaries; notebooks; personal, professional, and legal documents; scrapbook, and biographical and genealogical materials concerning Igor and Ružica Pereplotchikov and their ancestry and relatives. Arranged alphabetically by name of family member and then by type of material. Oversize items removed and stored along with other oversize materials in Flat box #751.

<u>Subseries 3: Photographs, 1880s-2002.</u> Contains mostly Igor and Ružica Pereplotchikov's family photographs, also photographs of their relatives and friends covering the period of the 1900s-2002. Arranged by type of photograph and then chronologically. Group photographs of Igor and Ružica with various people appear throughout the subseries, cross-references provided just for photographs stored outside the subseries. Oversize items removed and stored along with other oversize materials in the Flat boxes #750-751.

Also included is a photograph of Natalija, Queen, consort of Milan Obrenović, King of Serbia.

Subseries 4: Ephemera, 1910s-1960s. Ephemera of both Series I and Series II stored in box 15.

<u>Subseries 5: Oversize Material, 1900s-1951.</u> Contains oversize documents and photographs. Stored along with oversize materials of Series I in the Flat Boxes #750-751. Cross-referenced in the corresponding series and subseries.
