DESCRIPTION:

Letters addressed to Roman Grynberg (1893-), and a few to his wife, Sophie (1902-1980). Grynberg was editor of the literary almanacs Opyty and Vozdushnye Puti. Included are 28 letters by Vladimir Nabokov (1943-63); 29 by Edmund Wilson (1943-70); 3 by Julian Tuwim (1944-47); 10 by Georgii Adamovich (1962-64); and 1 by Vera Nabokova (1962). Also included are a poem by Nabokov, "Romanu i Sone ot geroia 'Dara;'" a corrected galley proof by Wilson for the New Yorker, "Seeing Chekhov Plain;" a typescript of a poem by Marina Tsvetaeva, beginning "Zerna ognennogo tsveta;" and a series of poems, by Elena [Mikhailovna?] Tager, written in the Soviet Union in 1946-54.
