DESCRIPTION:

Papers of Nikolai V. Maryshev (1882-), consisting of correspondence, manuscripts, documents, and printed materials. Maryshev, a lawyer, worked in various positions in the USSR, including in the Ukrainian sugar industry in the 1920s and 1930s. Eventually he was arrested and sentenced to a labor camp. During World War II he lived in Vinnitsa, and then went to Germany, first as an Ostarbeiter and then as a displaced person. His handwritten memoirs (ca. 200p.) deal with these topics and with his childhood and education. There are materials relating to his work in the Russian Orthodox Church in Western Europe after the war.
