DESCRIPTION. Photocopies of typescripts of reports and letters by French lawyer Eugène Petit (-). Petit, who had ties to French right-wing socialists, was sent to Petrograd in 1915 to act as liaison between the French Ministry of Armaments and War Production and its Russian counterpart. These reports and letters, some of them in extract form, cover from September 1916 to ~~February~~ 1918; they total 623 pages. Also included is an offprint of an article by Ioannis Sinanoglou that was partly based on this material.
