Papers of Konstantin V. Sakharov (1881-1941), White Army general. Sakharov served in both the Russo-Japanese War and World War I. In the Civil War he was a commanding officer under Admiral Kolchak. He emigrated to Germany after the war. The collection consists of manuscripts, clippings and books. The manuscripts include a biography of Sakharov and a bibliography of his works, both written by his wife. There is likewise an essay by Sakharov himself, "Die Herrgottsbienen". There are newspaper clippings and two books written by Sakharov, Die tschechischen Legionen in Sibirien (Berlin, 1936) and Der verratene Armee (Berlin, 1938).
