DESCRIPTION: Correspondence of Il'ia L. Tolstoi (1866-1933), son of Lev Tolstoi. Nearly all the correspondence is between Il'ia Tolstoi and his wife, Nadezhda Klement'evna Tolstaia. It primarily dates from the 1920's and concerns the lecture series Il'ia Tolstoi gave throughout the United States and in Paris. There is one letter from Aleksandra L. Tolstaia and a folder of official correspondence relating to the lecture series, including several letters from Tolstoi's manager. There is a brief essay by Tolstoi entitled "A Democratic Peace" and an unidentified photograph, presumably of Nadezhda Tolstaia.
