DESCRIPTION: Papers of Maksim M. Vinaver (1862-1926). Vinaver was a lawyer and a leading Russian liberal; he was a founder of the Constitutional Democrat (Kadet) Party, and a delegate to the first Russian State Duma. In the emigration he settled in Paris and edited the weekly Zveno.

These papers consist of correspondence, manuscripts, and printed materials. The correspondence consists of typed copies of letters sent by Vinaver and Ivan Petrunkevich to each other. Manuscripts include a Duma speech by Vinaver on the Bialystok pogrom of 1906 and two items on Russian politics by him. There is also an essay by Petr Iurenev on the Vinaver-Petrunkevich correspondence. Printed materials include bound copies of Zveno for 1926-28, and six books by or about Vinaver.
