DESCRIPTION:

Correspondence, manuscripts, subject files, and printed materials of Sergei L. Voitsekhovskii (or Woyciechowski; 1900-1985), Russian emigre political and organizational activist in Poland and the United States, and author of Trest: Vospominaniia i dokumenty (London, Ont., 1974). Correspondents include Tat'iana Dubrovskaiia, Nikolai Obruchev, Vasilii Orekhov, Igor' Sikorskii, Boris Solonevich, and many others; there are also memoirs by Voitsekhovskii on emigres whom he knew. There are files on the Rossiiskii Politicheskii Komitet (Russian Political Committee) in New York; on the Pushkin Fund; extensive materials concerning emigre monarchist and anti-Communist groups (for example, the Solidarists); and reviews of the Russian emigre press ("Obzor pressy") prepared by Voitsekhovskii in 1962-75.
