DESCRIPTION: Papers of members of the Chechulin family. The collection includes correspondence, manuscripts, documents, and photographs, chiefly from the third quarter of the nineteenth century. Fedor F. Chechulin (or Tschetschulin; 1818-71) was a Russian merchant in Finland; his wife, Hilda, was Swedish. The collection includes letters from Fedor Chechulin to his wife, from 1856-65, in Swedish with later Russian translations; documents and other correspondence from 1847-77; a manuscript about the family by Ekaterina Maidel'; several family photographs; and a memoir by Polina Petrovich Chechulina, the niece of Fedor Chechulin, about her experiences as a physical development instructor for the family of Grand Prince Konstantin Konstantinovich from about the end of the nineteenth century to World War I.
