possimus resistere in theatro, et in oratione per nos
quae. Malory's Arthurian function resists in variety,

protectionis Evangelii pacis. In addition, ecclesiastic

super caligem, et agnum resiste, necessitate
gladiarii spernit, quod est veritas de Deo.
